



EQUIPMENT LIST

The following list is intended to give you some guidance around how best to equip yourself to participate in a range of classes and activities. Costs listed below are indicative based on our research, however it is suggested that you shop around to find the most cost-effective option.

Please read through this thoroughly and make sure you're prepared to start work! During your first week we will check that you have all the essential items on the list (marked in **green**) – other items will be needed by the time you start on your first show roles in mid-November.

Costs listed below are indicative based on our research, however many are available cheaper than listed.

1. A lockable tool box for your equipment (clearly marked with your name)	£15-£25
2. Retractable steel tape measure (5 meter minimum) - must be high quality	£10
3. Stanley knife or similar	£10
4. Head torch	£30
5. Podger or Quad Spanner 13/17mm x 19/21mm	£30
6. Adjustable Wrench	£20
7. Multitool - Gerber/Leatherman or similar	£30
8. Camera (we recommend a digital SLR camera) or a non-digital camera with at least 800ASA film. (or phone that takes decent quality photos) This is to record your work for portfolios and productions	Optional cost

Clothing		Approx. cost
1.	Sensible and comfortable working clothes - at various times you will be up ladders and using heavy duty wood cutting equipment.	£40 <i>(including combat trousers, T-shirt and sweater/fleece)</i>
2.	Sensible footwear, including something with good grip for ladder work with rubber soles.	£30-£40
3.	Safety Boots or Safety Trainers (Steel toe cap)	£45-£60
4.	Set of black clothes for performances. You will need a pair of black trousers and two long sleeved black tops, (to ensure whole top is covered from neck down) or short sleeve with jumper) (<u>absolutely no logos</u> or other colours are allowed on these clothes and no holes, rips or textured decorations).	£30-£40 <i>(including combat trousers and long sleeved T-shirt)</i>
5.	A pair of quiet, flat black shoes for performances.	£25 <i>(can be the same as sensible footwear)</i>
6.	Old clothes or overalls for painting.	£15-£20 <i>(for new overalls)</i>

1.	USB flash drive	£5
2.	Scale ruler that must include 1:25 and 1:50 – 1 scale per edge, avoid multi scales on the same side (these should be the triangular variety but make sure they have the correct scales on them as not all do).	£8

Basic stationery including the following items: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ A5 small notebook ▪ A4 paper (plain and lined) ▪ Diary (paper or on your phone or laptop) ▪ Pencil case large enough to hold the items listed below ▪ Tippex or a similar type of correction fluid ▪ Pencils and sharpener or preferably mechanical propelling with spare leads ▪ Pens ▪ Paper scissors and fabric scissors ▪ Stapler ▪ Hole puncher ▪ 30cm plastic ruler ▪ Folders (including an A4 ring binder to hold a record of your work) ▪ Sellotape ▪ Set square / Protractor / Compass Set ▪ Permanent Marker (Sharpie) ▪ Plastic wallets ▪ Black Clipboard (Robust) ▪ Wristwatch / Stop watch 	£20+
